LESSONS LEARNT

Organisation

- Strong programme & project management required
- Clear and achievable delivery plan that is funded
- Mix of data providers and data consumers required
- Regular contact and communication across all partners

Technical

- Be clear & honest about level of technical maturity/knowledge open systems/platforms/standards across all partners additional support may be needed
- Identify early the required data standards and apply consistently e.g FHIR
- Don't skimp on testing data and infrastructure involve end users

Sector Specific (LA Social Care)

- Use existing information standards (i.e. PRSB) but be prepared to adapt
- Be clear on the actual benefits to social care use-cases are vital
- Watch for terminology/labels that don't speak to a social care audience e.g. patient, clinician, clinical safety
