The GMS contractual requirements



Year	Requirement
2015	Promote and offer facility to access online the information held in coded form
2019	Offer all patients online access to all prospective data on the patient record unless exceptional circumstances apply.
2019	Full record access upon written request

Upcoming changes



Future access

GP IT system changes to provide access to future GP data for all patients who have an online account.

GP practices screen data as it is entered onto their IT system. Digital requests for historic coded data

Enable patients to send a request for historic coded GP records via the NHS App into general practice workflow.

Practice support

Advice, guidance and support for general practice to efficiently support and maximise benefit delivery.

GP IT supplier changes



Existing users

User settings updated to provide access to all data entered onto GP IT systems going forward Exceptional circumstances

General practices identify individuals to exclude prior to change or update user access settings after the change has been made **New users**

System defaults are changed so that new users have access to data entered from the date change was implemented







Hiding information from patient view

NHS

General practice will continue to have the existing ability to:

- hide information from patient view as it is entered into the patient record
- remove access to future data

This facility is already available to safeguard against harm and prevent disclosure of third party information for those that already have records access.





The practice must consider whether the disclosure to the data subject 'would be likely to cause serious harm to the physical or mental health of the data subject or another individual'. Circumstances in which information may be withheld on the grounds of serious harm are extremely rare.
