A new chapter

- Prototyped in lung cancer at Gloucestershire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust
- Now implementing for Haematology and prostate cancers at Oxford University Hospital NHS Foundation Trust





Systemic Anti-cancer Therapies

- 21,000 anti-cancer drug prescriptions in March 2022 alone in Oxfordshire
- Routine blood tests needed on average every 3 months
- Serious side effects of these therapies - ranging from heart attacks to bone marrow suppression
- 134 vacant oncology and haematology consultant posts across NHS in 2019-2020

Anti-cancer drug management

- Patients surviving longer due to new and improved anti-cancer drugs
- Management of these patients and their treatment is becoming impossible due to:
 - Sheer numbers of patients
 - Understaffing
 - No digital system to aid in the task



Why not digitise and Automate?

- Reminder Clinical Decision Support System (CDSS)
- Blood test requesting
- Blood test review
- ePrescribing

Aren't we all the same?

- Most cancer pathways are fairly similar
- A patient is:
 - Referred
 - Seen in clinic
 - Have tests
 - Have biopsies
 - Explanations for each step
 - Then treatment
- So why not "build once and share many"



Potential benefits of this new anti-cancer digital pathway



- Reduced staff workload
- Improved safety as blood test requesting and reviewing strongly linked with anti-cancer treatment prescribing
- Improved staff experience of managing the anti-cancer therapies by using a user-centred design approach
