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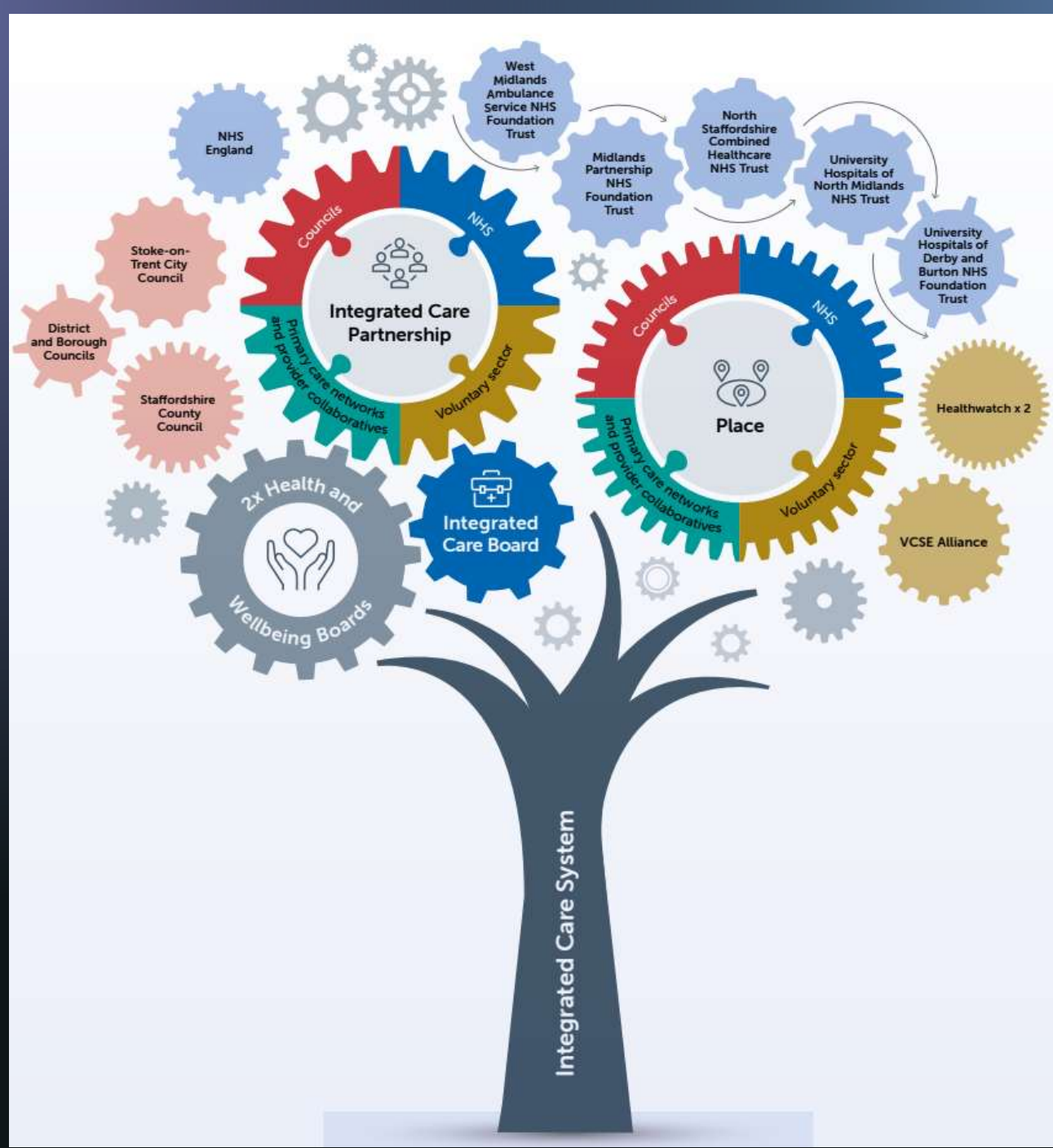
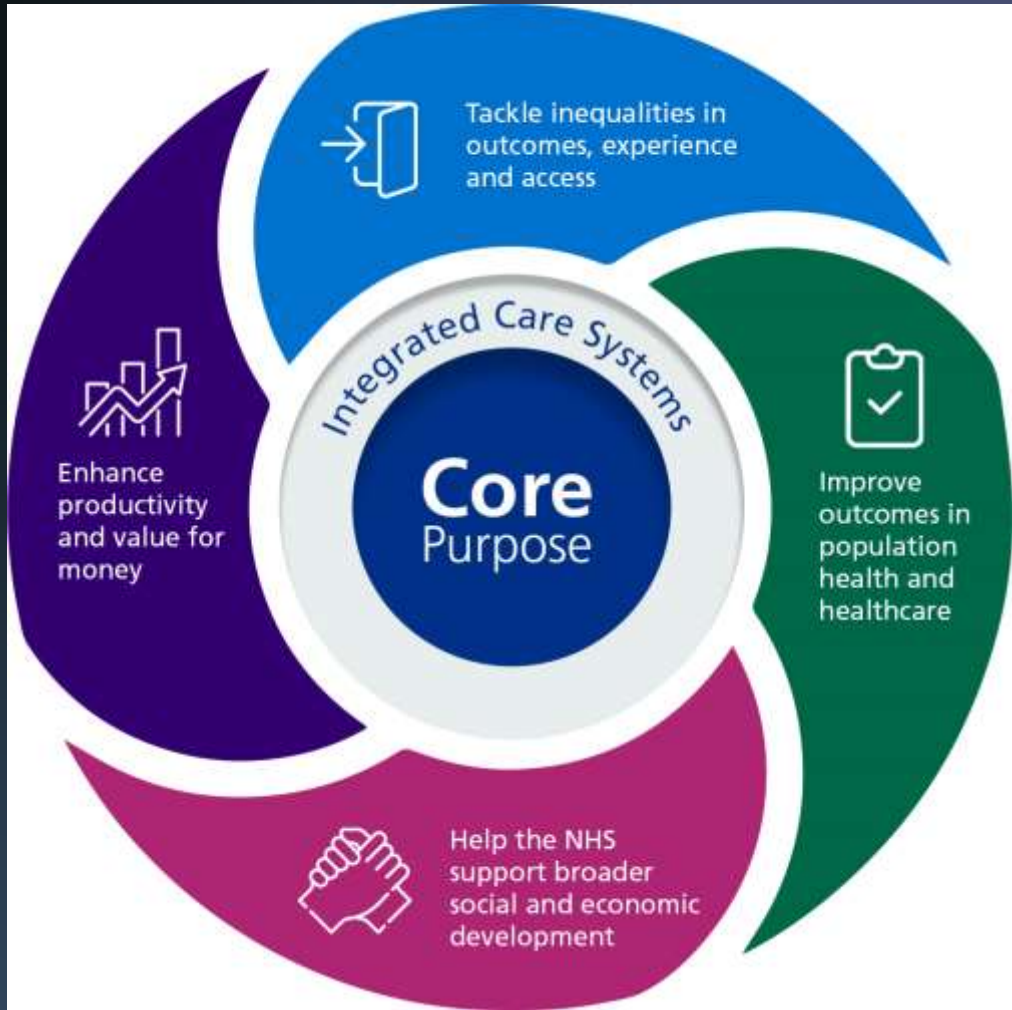

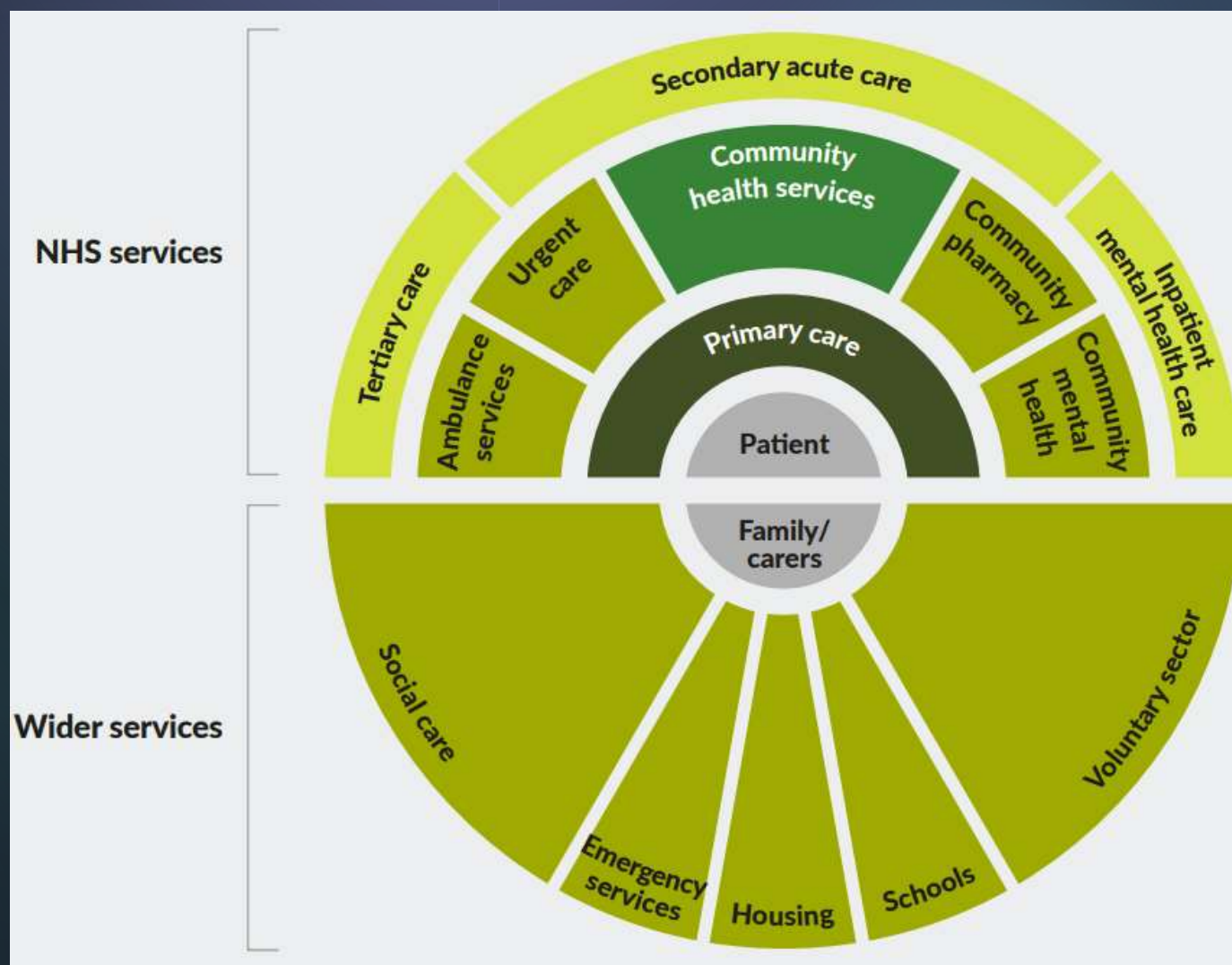


Foundations

Patient Centred Care

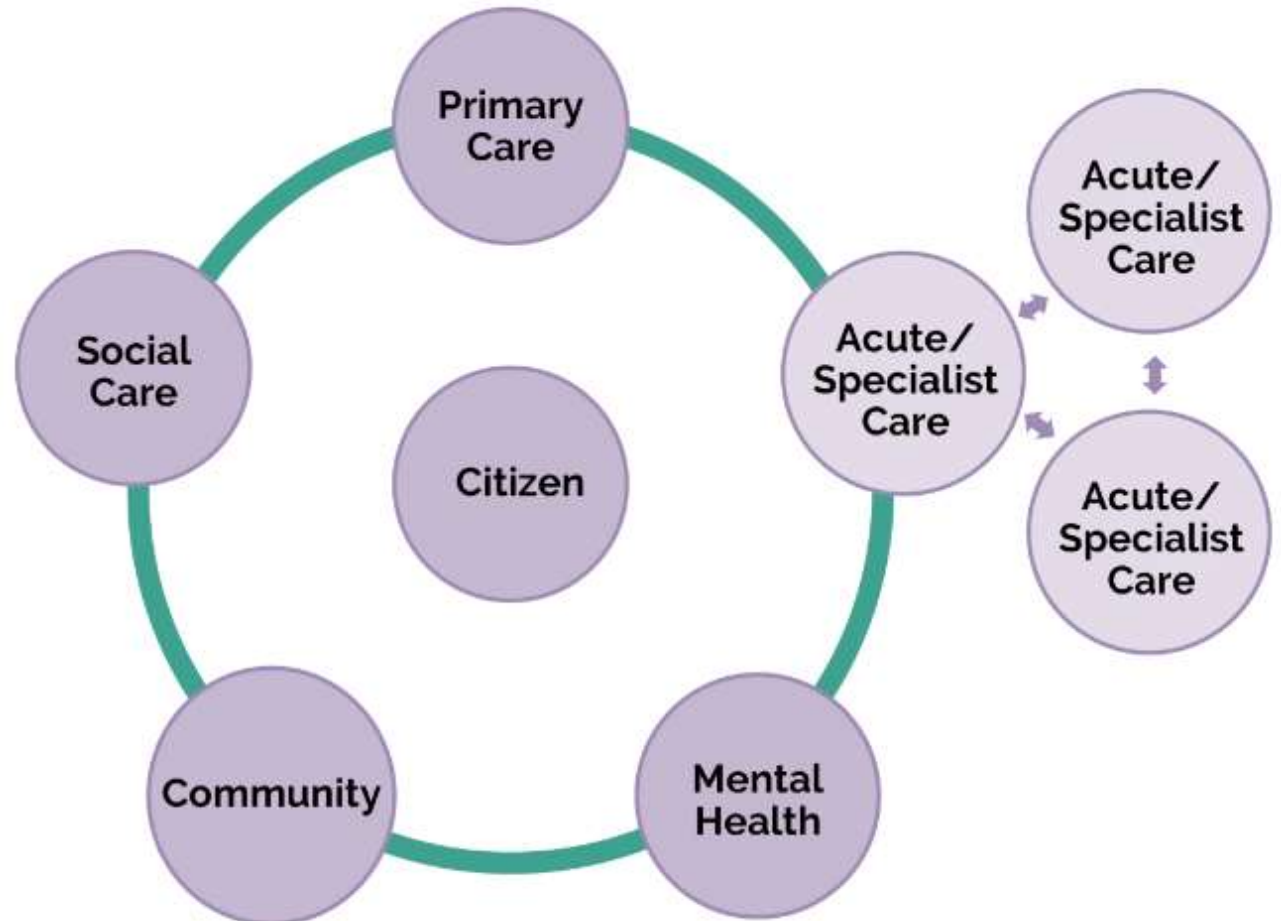


Model A: One EPR across the ICS



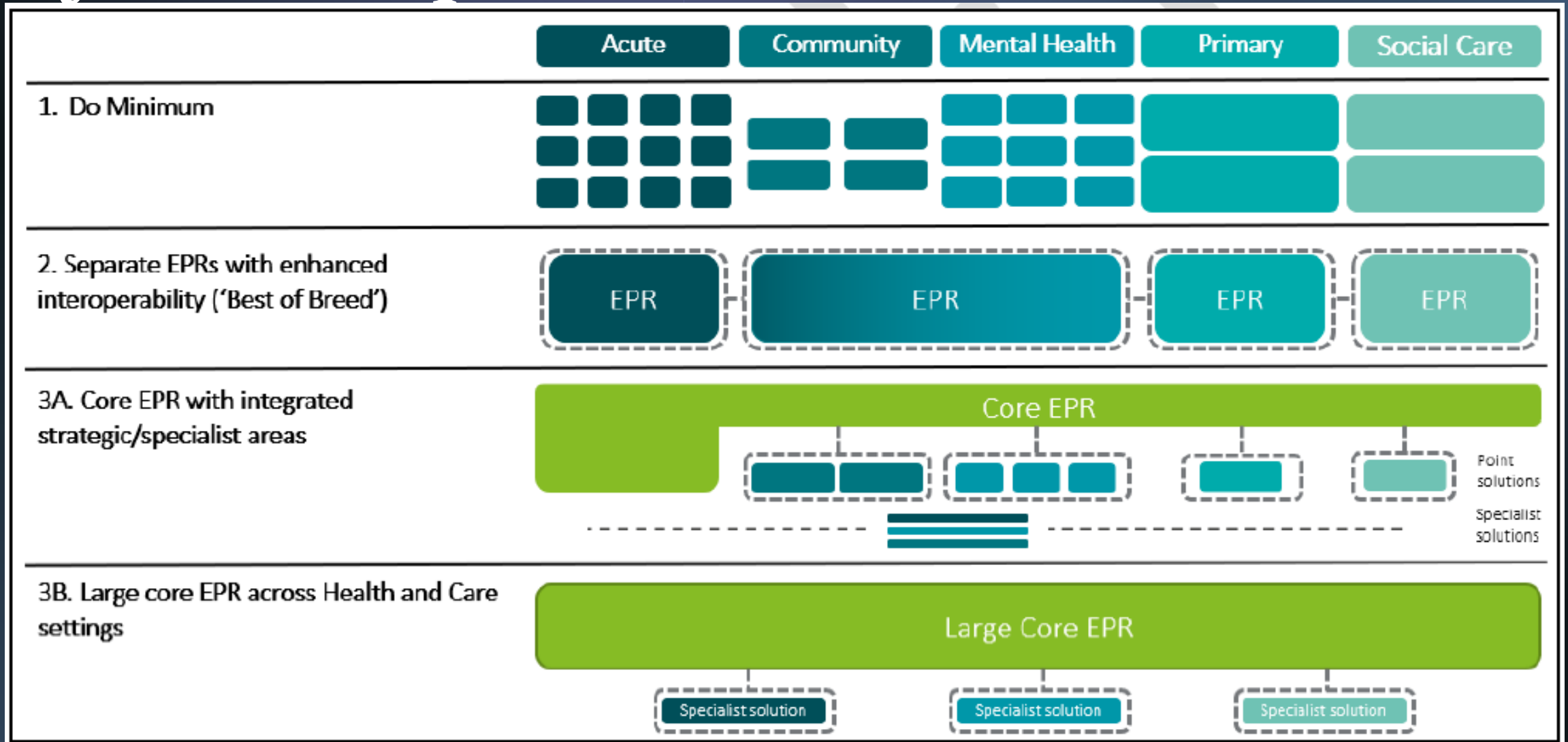
80% of patient flow is across different care settings
