Through the provision of maternity services, large amounts of data are created on a regular basis. Module 4 aims to provide maternity staff with an overview of datasets related to maternity services, how they can be used to improve service provision, and the considerations that should be taken into account to ensure the data are used safely.

Participants will explore this topic through readings, podcasts and videos. There will be activities with open questions, which will provide opportunities for reflection and discussion with other participants throughout the module
