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### An Overview


- A collaboration between Miss Natalie Nunes (O&G Consultant) and Lauren Trepte (Research Midwife) in the Early Pregnancy Unit.

- The VR headsets give the women an alternative view during the procedure with the view to lowering anxiety and pain.

- Women feel they are receiving individualized care
- Helps build a positive relationship with the women






## Patient Feedback Form Audit

- Greater sense of autonomy and choice 70% uptake
- Greater inclusivity equality and diversity
- Those using the headsets have lower pain scores
- 100% of women using the headsets would recommend them
- Felt listened to and their experience was valued
- Women who used the headsets more likely to give detailed feedback



# The Vision

- For the virtual reality head sets use to be embedded in outpatient medical miscarriage procedures
- Raising the profile of women centered care at the trust
- Pioneers in women's health services
- A study to be conducted in the use of Virtual Reality headsets for this procedure.
- To extend the use of the headsets to other NHS Trusts
- Expand to other womens health services sexual health, maternity and beyond!
